Trail Use Categories

Due to the expanse of the Grease Trail the use of the trail varies from section to section. Below is the outline of the intended uses for the specific segments of trail from the Fraser River to Tweedsmuir Provincial Park.

These designations are approved through the 1993 Alexander Mackenzie Heritage Trail Management Plan.

IV Category of Present Trail Bed

- A. Aboriginal Foot Path - undisturbed foot path. These sections are used for hiking and horse packing presently.
- B. Wagon Road - trail portions passable by horse drawn wagons and all terrain vehicles.
- C. Four-wheel Drive Road - wagon road occasionally used by all terrain and four-wheel drive vehicles. Vehicle access is very difficult.
- D. Gravel Road - trail portions that have been upgraded to above two-wheel drive access on trail. This includes Forest Roads, Private Access Roads and Highways.
